### **Recommendation:**

**APPROVE** Budget Adjustment/Transfer 19-20-01.

### **Summary:**

In October 2017, the Local Transportation Authority (LTA) Board approved the submittal of a County Express Website Update and Enhancement project to Caltrans for Public Transportation Modernization, Improvement, and Service Enhancement Account (PTMISEA) funds. Staff was notified by Caltrans that the project was not eligible for PTMISEA funds as it was considered an operations, versus capital, improvement. Staff has identified alternate eligible funds for the project requiring Budget Adjustment/Transfer 19-20-01 increasing LTA's approved 2019-20 budgeted Contract Line Item by \$45,000. No PTMISEA funds were lost due to this determination with the capital funds planned for replacement vehicle cost instead.

### **Financial Considerations:**

The LTA's 2017 Transit Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Plan estimated that the County Express Website Update and Enhancement Projec would cost \$45,000 via third party procurement. The newly identified project funds are Transportation Development Act State Transit Assistance operating funds.

### **Background:**

The Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality and Port Security Bond Act of 2006 (Proposition 1B), was approved by California voters on November 7, 2006. The Act created PTMISEA capital funds for transit operators for capital projects. In the past, the LTA has applied for many projects including replacement vehicles, spare vehicles, bus stop signs, tokens, and schedule holders.

As recommended by the LTA 2016 Short Range Long Range Transit Plan and 2017 Transit ITS Plan, LTA submitted an allocation request for \$45,000 of PTMISEA funds for a County Express Website Update and Enhancement project, with the purpose of a website redesign. Staff has identified a need for significant improvements to the County Express website to make it mobile friendly and ensure compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act regulation. This project submittal to Caltrans was approved by the LTA Board in October 2017 via Resolution 17-07.

Caltrans reviewed the project and determined that it was not eligible for PTMISEA funds as it was considered an operations improvement. The LTA musst use PTMISEA funds for capital improvements.

Staff identified alternate Transportation Development Act State Transit Assistance operating funds for the project with no PTMISEA funds lost due to Caltrans' determination. The LTA will use remaining PTMISEA capital funds for replacement vehicle cost instead.

### **Staff Analysis:**

Budget Adjustment/Transfer 19-20-01 increases LTA's 2019-20 budgeted Contract Line Item by \$45,000. As authorized in the LTA Purchasing/Budget policy, staff has submitted to the Executive Director for approval

Consistent with the Purchasing/Budget policy, staff requests the LTA Board further approve Budget Adjustment/Transfer 19-20-01.

Subject: Local Transportation Authority Response to COVID-19 Shelter in Place Order

### **Recommendation:**

**RECEIVE** Update on Local Transportation Authority's COVID-19 Response and **AFFIRM** the LTA's Free Fare Policy Effective March 19. 2020.

### **Summary:**

Staff is recommending that the Local Transportation Authority (LTA) Board receive an update on how the agency and its public transportation service contractors, MV Transportation and Jovenes de Antaño, have responded to the COVID-19 pandemic.

### **Financial Considerations:**

Due to the nature of emergencies, the total financial impacts to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and future eligible reimbursement amounts are unknown and subject to change. Initially, LTA anticipates receiving federal financial support through the passing of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act with funds distributed through the Federal Transit Administration Section 5311 Formula Grants for Rural Areas Program administered by Caltrans.

No local match is required for the CARES Act funds which are available until expended or until the federal emergency declaration has been lifted. Reimbursable expenses include operating costs to maintain service and lost revenue due to the public health emergency, including the purchase of personal protective equipment, and paying for administrative leave of operations personnel due to reductions in service. Further program details have yet to be determined.

### **Background:**

A novel coronavirus (named COVID-19) was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China, in December 2019. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) considers the virus to be a very serious public health threat, based on current information. In part, the virus is considered a serious public threat because much is unknown and there is no vaccine or specific antiviral treatment.

The number of reported cases of COVID-19 has escalated dramatically over a short period of time with the World Health Organization declaring a pandemic. As of April 7, 2020, there are over 400,000 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the United States, of which 16,000 are in California with

community spread. For this reason, California Governor Newson issued a Proclamation of a State of Emergency on March 4, 2020. When preparing this staff report, San Benito County has 31 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and multiple cases have been confirmed in neighboring Santa Clara County, where many San Benito County residents travel routinely (including by LTA's public transportation services) for work, school, and other activities.

In response to COVID-19, the San Benito County Public Health Officer issued a shelter-in-place order on March 17, 2020 requiring residents to stay at home except for essential needs to help reduce the spread of the virus. The shelter-in-place order was later updated further restricting activities and extending the effective date through May 3, 2020.

### **Staff Analysis:**

Due to the fluid nature of this public health emergency response, LTA staff and its public transportation service contractors, MV Transportation and Jovenes de Antaño, have done the following in response to the COVID-19:

- February 17, 2020: County Express (CE) and Specialized Transportation (ST) contractors increase the frequency of vehicle interior cleaning and good personal hygiene is encouraged amongst staff.
- March 9, 2020: "Stop the Spread" Center of Disease Control flyers are directed by LTA to be posted in the CE and ST vehicles.
- March 13, 2020: Senior Lunch Transportation Program was suspended in response to the Jovenes de Antaño congregate meal sites closures.
- March 18, 2020: CE Fixed Route and Intercounty Gavilan services are reduced in response
  to the Hollister School District schools and Gavilan Community College closures. LTA's
  administration and operations offices are closed to the public. CE emphasizes only essential
  travel and the need for physical distancing to its clients.
- March 20, 2020: Due to an approximate 75% reduction in ridership, CE Fixed Route, Intercounty Gavilan, and weekend Dial-a-Ride services are eliminated. The CE contractor begins to assist the ST contractor to provide Out of County Medical Transportation service to offer trips with physical distancing to dialysis treatments.
- March 20, 2020: CE and ST fare collection is suspended for increased front line staff safety, allowing for social distancing.
- March 25, 2020: Personal bags with cleaning supplies are provided to CE drivers at the beginning of shifts.
- March 30, 2020: ST Senior Lunch Transportation Program service hours are used to deliver meals to home-bound seniors.

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- March 31, 2020: LTA distributes additional vehicle interior cleaning supplies to the CE and ST contractors. Supplies were offered by the San Benito High School transportation program in response to a request from LTA.
- April 2, 2020: LTA submits an order through the California Association for Coordinated Transportation for surgical masks and hand sanitizer for the CE and ST contractors.
- April 8, 2020: LTA distributes additional cleaning supplies to contractors. Supplies were obtained by the San Benito County Office of Emergency Services.

Staff has been working remotely, continually participates in federal and state COVID-19 public transportation webinars, and regularly communicates with LTA's CE and ST contractors to keep up to date on need changes to service and safety.

At this time, staff requests the Board affirm LTA's operational policy of offering free fares for CE and ST services to reduce the further spread of the COVID-19 virus. Fares collection would be reinstated once the San Benito County Public Health Officer shelter-in-place order has been lifted.
