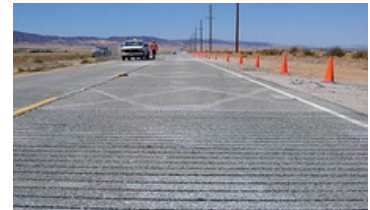
SR 25/156 Turbo Roundabout



Anticipated on August 16, Caltrans will begin work on one of the final stages of the SR 25/156 Turbo Roundabout construction project. This stage of construction will require a new, temporary traffic configuration at the intersection of highways 25 and 156. **The temporary configuration will operate similar to a one-lane roundabout** and will remain in place through the end of construction in early 2024, when the new, two-lane Turbo Roundabout is opened to the public.

During construction, as vehicles approach, they will be required to slow down and yield to traffic already in the roundabout before entering. **There will be no signalized traffic lights, however travelers will see new yield signage and other advanced alerts to advise of the upcoming intersection change.**

Approximately one week in advance, Caltrans will place portable electronic message signs to alert travelers of the upcoming traffic configuration change.



Travelers will see roundabout signs, yield signs, rumble strips and continued 35 MPH speed limit signs, to increase awareness and improve safety in the construction zone.

Caltrans is coordinating with CHP and other local agencies to ensure safety throughout the duration of this work. Speed limits within the project area remain reduced to 35 MPH for the safety of travelers and construction crews.

This temporary traffic configuration is necessary to allow crews to complete final work inside the middle of the intersection for the future Turbo Roundabout.

This \$14.6 million project will reduce the number and severity of collisions through this critical interchange.
